Enclosed is copy of telegram sent to you this morn-ing.

You willnote that I talked to Mr. Clauson, Sales Manager of Outboard Motors Sales Corporation, and he advised me that a new motor is being developed with a direct drive. We are, of course, greatly interested in this motor but can not wait for deliveries. He also said that some complications would arise if we took delivery of these motors at Los Angeles on account of their distributor here, and I suggested that he bill our Company at Oakland.

Apparently he had just received my letter and telegram a few minutes prior to talking with me over the telephone and did not appreciate the necessity of a real price on these motors. He quoted \$45.00 per motor and then reduced it to \$40.00. I think you will agree with me that he is just about fifty percent too high on these motors as Harry Reynolds tells me that in quantities of 1,000 or more a similar motor could be built here in Los Angeles for approximately \$15.00.

You will be interested to know that we have received a definite order from Harold Lloyd for delivery at Palm Springs as soon as possible, and many new leads are opening from day to day.

Please let me hear from you as I am anxious to know what progress you make in Milwaukee.
